

Instructions for photo books with photo paper

Care

The photo book's pages are very sensitive to liquids. Even small drops can cause the pages to stick together and permanently damage the book. Water drops can be carefully removed using an absorbent cloth. Then leave the page to dry in the air. Dry spots may be left. If damp spots are not treated and the pages turned or if the book is closed, the pages may stick together. Fingerprints or dirt can be carefully removed using pure alcohol. It's important to not rub for too hard or too long.

Storage

When stored under optimal conditions, the paper will keep its colour for many years. A dark, cool and dry environment is preferable. The book may warp if it is exposed to too much humidity or if the temperature is too high. Ideally, the photo book should be stored on its side or on a shelf between other books. Most books tend to deform when they are left freestanding. Direct exposure to light or sunlight will cause fading in the long term.
